Our Story

There are thousands of stray animals in Sri Lanka suffering from horrific injuries, malnutrition and disease. Dogs and cats with fractured spines, severed limbs and maggot infested wounds; pups and kittens living on festering rubbish dumps; animals slowly dying of tick fever, womb infections and bleeding tumours, suffering in agony until they die. With the risk and associated fear of rabies, strays are often demonised, leading to cruelty at the hands of humans. This ocean of suffering and misery is heart breaking for any animal lover to witness, let alone walk away from. Animal SOS Sri Lanka, a UK registered charity, was founded on the vision of Kim Cooling who, after witnessing the appalling plight of animals there, particularly the strays, decided to take action to help them. With a distinct lack of safe havens and veterinary care available to street animals in Sri Lanka, our work and facilities are a lifeline to many otherwise doomed animals.



OUR ACHIEVEMENTS JANUARY - NOVEMBER 2022

- We are currently caring for 2053 dogs and 25 cats at the sanctuary
- We provided over 25,000 treatments for disease, wounds, fractures and tumours
- We sterilized 650 dogs and cats and conducted 325 other surgeries
- We provided over 10,000 blood tests/smears/biochemistry/ haematology
- We provided over 11.000 antiparasitic treatments (worming, mange, tick/flea treatments)
- We provided over 10,000 vaccinations against rabies and other deadly viruses
- We feed around 2,500 cats and dogs EVERY day and operate the largest feeding program and largest animal sanctuary for street animals in Sri Lanka

Our vet spotted Bosco on her way home from work and quickly alerted us. We rushed to the rescue and brought him to the sanctuary.

His face was literally sliced in half from an embedded rope cloth. The wound was teeming with maggots and the poor soul was in the most horrific state. But, we gave him a chance as our team are experts in wound care. Within a short space of time Bosco improved and the wound healed.

In many places, dogs like this would be euthanized, but this is another example of why we give them a chance, as most heal with the right care.

PHOENIX

Phoenix was brutally attacked and almost killed by a savage lynch mob, including children, in Thanamalwila- they even dug a grave for him. A brave person managed to get him away just before he died, but he was left critically injured and was not safe in that area. We stepped in to help. Phoenix arrived at the sanctuary with wounds and is disabled because of a spinal injury from the brutal attack. He was so traumatised, he growled whenever someone approached.

However, one of our lovely managers has spent time regaining his trust in humans and now he is the most loving and friendly boy ever.



Phoenix, like his name, rose again in full glory, defying death and we were there to save him and give him a new life. This is why our work is so important in a place where there is rampant animal cruelty and no tough animal protection laws.



FROM SRI LANKA TO RUSSIA TO FRANCE TO ANTIGUA

You may remember the story about Daisy (renamed River) in the last newsletter. She was adopted by a lovely Russian couple who visited the sanctuary and fell in love with her. Well, this Sri Lankan street pooch must be one of the best travelled dogs ever as the couple have moved again from Russia and are now living in Antigua. route and now has lovely beaches in Antigua to enjoy.

PARIS

We rescued Paris one evening and how he suffered. He had maggots and pus coming from his ears, cartilage missing from ear canals, totally emaciated, hypothermic, hairless, anaemic, had babesia (tick-borne disease) mange. Yet, he is such a sweet, trusting boy. We gave him his health and life back.



SOME OF THE MANY LIVES SAVED AND TRANSFORMED



PUFFIN

Puffin, a sweet old girl, was suffering on the streets with multiple health issues for a long, long while. We rescued her and nursed her back to health. Puffin was suffering from blood parasites diseases, a mammary tumour, ear infections, an aural hematoma, cataracts and sarcoptic mange. She had the happiest ending as our lovely manager, Lucie, and her partner, adopted her and she lives happily ever after with them.

ETHAN

We see such absolute horrors in our daily work. Ethan was in a field and somehow got his nose severed by a machine. We were alerted and took him in.

Our vets had to perform surgery the next day. The severed section could not be saved, but Ethan can eat a soft diet, drink and has recovered extremely well considering his injury. It's amazing how strong and resilient these dogs are if given the chance to survive. Ethan means strong, and he certainly lives up to his name. Ethan lives happily at the sanctuary.





MARKY



MARKY

We took in this very weak cat that was found in a market. He was malnourished, had a urinary infection and a hernia. We made him healthy again and he was recently adopted by our manager.

GRANDPA ARCHIBALD

This poor old boy was pitifully crying in pain on the street for a long while without the help he needed, until we stepped in to save his life.

Named Grandpa Archibald, an intact elderly male dog, it appears he met with an accident and was left disabled. He arrived dehydrated, with wounds and tick-borne diseases that cause severe anaemia. We nursed him through and he is a happy boy now.





COCA COLA

Coca Cola has also made a miraculous recovery. He was barely alive on arrival and could only lift his head. He was starved, dehydrated and dying from tick-borne disease. We brought him back from the brink.





MUSIC

Look at Music now! He arrived at the sanctuary with a heavily infected severed limb stump, tick-borne diseases-babesia gibsoni and Ehrlichiosis, but with the correct diagnosis, treatments and lots of love and care, he made a wonderful recovery.

DOSHY



HOMING

We try to find as many suitable homes as possible for the dogs and cats we have nursed back to health because that allows us to take in more dire emergencies. We simply can't keep every animal we rescue or are dumped at the sanctuary. So many pups are dumped every week and it's a huge strain on our capacity and limited resources. We mainly home pups as adult dogs are harder to find decent homes for in Sri Lanka. All homed animals

are neutered and fully vaccinated and we offer free vaccinations and veterinary care for life for every homed SOS dog and cat. That way, these dogs and cats live longer and healthier lives.

BIRTHDAY FEEDING PROGRAM



On the eve of her birthday in October, Kim, the founder of the charity who was in Sri Lanka, wanted to do a huge community feeding program that went well into the night, finishing at 10.45pm. Feeding starving street animals is the most fulfilling act ever and the dogs and cats were so grateful.

Whilst carrying out this massive operation, we treated many dogs with skin conditions too. So, all in all, so many animals benefitted and so many empty tums were filled.





Around 650 street animals were fed that evening. With our sanctuary animals too, that equates to 2650 dogs and cats fed a cooked meal on that single day!

I.5 tonne of food was freshly cooked. Our dedicated kitchen started work at 4am to prepare this huge quantity of food. It was an amazing team effort and the best birthday gift for Kim.

The dire economic crisis in Sri Lanka continues to have a profound effect on the charity. In the last months we are struggling to raise our running costs and our expenditure has exceeded our income. Food costs, medicine, electricity to run the sanctuary, fuel for our vehicles, gas to cook for our animals, and just about everything else has soared. We have had increased expenses of having to buy a new generator as our old generator was failing and without power. With constant power cuts in Sri Lanka, we simply can't function at the sanctuary without basics like electricity and water. We have many essential repairs at the sanctuary too, like leaking roofs and had to fund a new tube well as we had an inadequate water supply for our operations. Imagine running out of water when we are caring for 2000 plus rescues! We face so many daily challenges trying to help the voiceless and so much more needs to be done at the sanctuary, but lack of funds is always our greatest obstacle.

Life is extremely fragile for street animals in Sri Lanka but for some pets like Cindy, a Great Dane, the suffering is just as bad. Cindy was almost lifeless when we took her in. She was just skin and bones, had huge pressure wounds and could barely lift her head. We battled to save her life, something we do 365 days a year at our sanctuary in Sri Lanka. Cindy survived along with 1000s of other dogs and cats that we have nursed back to health from the brink.

Animal SOS Sri Lanka is a UK Registered Charity, dedicated to alleviating the widespread suffering of dogs and cats in Sri Lanka. We provide veterinary care, free neutering and vaccination programs, adoption schemes and animal welfare education.
