OUR STORY Every day in Sri Lanka, thousands of stray animals endure unimaginable suffering. Dogs and cats with shattered limbs, fractured spines, and maggot-infested wounds, struggle to survive. Puppies and kittens are born into lives of misery, scavenging through rotting rubbish dumps, roaming on busy roads, battling disease and starvation. Many slowly succumb to painful conditions like tick fever, infected wombs, viruses and bleeding, maggot infested wounds and tumors - dying in agony, unseen and unheard.

The threat of rabies fuels local fear and stigma, turning these vulnerable animals into targets of cruelty. In the absence of effective animal welfare laws, national neutering programs, veterinary care, and safe refuges, the suffering of these voiceless beings continues unchecked.

Animal SOS Sri Lanka, a UK-registered charity, was founded by Kim Cooling after she personally witnessed the heartbreaking plight of these animals. Refusing to turn away, she created a sanctuary and support network that now serves as a vital lifeline for strays with nowhere else to turn. In a country where animal welfare is critically under-resourced, our charity provides veterinary care, food, shelter, and, above all, compassion. We work tirelessly to rescue, rehabilitate, and protect those most in need.

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS JANUARY 2025 - JUNE 2025

We are currently caring for 2215 dogs and 30 cats at the sanctuary

We provided over 10,000 treatments for disease, wounds, fractures and tumours

We sterilized 400 dogs and cats and conducted 300 other surgeries

We provided 4,900 blood tests /smears/ biochemistry/haematology

We provided over 5,000 anti-parasitic treatments (worming, mange, tick/flea treatments)

We provided over 5,000 vaccinations against rabies and other deadly viruses

We feed around 2,700 dogs and cats EVERY day and operate the largest feeding program and largest animal sanctuary for street animals in Sri Lanka





We took her in last December. Not long after, she gave birth to a beautiful pup named Gloria. Despite everything she'd endured, Parnella was the most loving mother.






Every life we save - like Parnella's - reminds us why rescue, rehabilitation, and neutering are so critical.



NEUTERING - ENDING SUFFERING BEFORE IT STARTS





Too often, we witness tiny, vulnerable animals struggling to survive on busy roads. It's a heartbreaking sight and one we are committed to ending. One of the greatest challenges we face is finding puppies and kittens constantly dumped outside our gates – frightened, and often clinging to life. Week after week, these unwanted litters arrive, placing enormous strain on our stretched resources. We know this cycle of suffering will never end unless we stop it at the source. That's why neutering is one of the most powerful tools we have.





At our sanctuary, once animals recover from injuries or illness, they are vaccinated and neutered. But our work doesn't stop at the sanctuary gates. We try to run free monthly community spay/neuter programs – preventing countless litters from being born into pain, starvation, and danger on the streets.




Neutering reduces animal suffering. Fewer road injuries. Fewer babies left to die alone.

Recently, we rescued a young Brahminy kite that had become entangled in kite string high up in a tree on our sanctuary grounds. With great bravery, one of our staff members climbed the tree to free the traumatised and injured bird.

We named this beautiful bird Ollie Beak. After three weeks of dedicated care and rehabilitation, Ollie regained full health and was released back into the wild – soaring once again where he belongs. Another precious life saved, thanks to the incredible compassion and commitment of our amazing team.





But Jaws is no ordinary dog. He pulled through against all odds, showing incredible resilience and the will to live.














TERESA: FROM FRAGILE TO FLOURISHING








FROM HEARTBREAK TO HEALING HOW YOUR KINDNESS CHANGES LIVES





Priscilla was tied to a tree and left to die – just a pup, discarded like she didn't matter. When she was found, her tiny body was crawling with ticks, puncture wounds lined her neck, and maggots had begun to invade the open flesh. She was critically anaemic, weak, and barely clinging to life.

With urgent medical care, loving hands, and sheer determination, we pulled this gentle soul back from the brink. It was a race against time - but Priscilla's will to live was stronger than her suffering.

Today, she's safe and loved.



BANDITA'S BRAVE COMEBACK: FROM PARALYSIS TO PAWPRINTS

Bandita came to us as a frail pup – paralysed after a brutal dog attack on the streets. Her tiny front legs were fused together, rendering her unable to even sit upright. She bore painful abscesses and signs of suspected brain trauma. She was hurt, helpless, and barely holding on. But Bandita's spirit was stronger than her injuries. With dedicated medical care, gentle physiotherapy, and the healing power of love, this little fighter began to defy the odds. Day by day, she regained strength. Inch by inch, she moved forward.

Kala arrived in a shocking state - ravaged by mange, blood parasite diseases, critical anaemia and cancer (TVT). 






MAGINTO'S STORY: FROM SHATTERED TO STRONG

His jaw was shattered after consuming baited food (Hakka Patas), a cruel man-made explosive device hidden in food that detonates when an animal bites into it. He was nothing but skin and bones, unable to eat, and in terrible pain. A failed jaw surgery attempted elsewhere, only worsened his suffering. Most would have given up on him.











SEVEN

Hungry and desperate, Seven ate Hakka Patas – baited food laced with explosives. It shattered her mouth and lower jaw. She was rushed to a vet, stitched up without sedation and left in terrible pain. She was also battling tick-borne diseases – weak, feverish, and barely holding on to life. Then we stepped in. We didn't give up. She had the surgery he needed, the pain relief he was desperate for, and a second chance at life.

TOTA

Tota was born in 2021 and is a Short Spine Syndrome dog. His genetic condition is very rare. His legs are deformed, he has no neck and some muscle wastage. He was also covered in ticks and had a dangerous blood disease called babesia gibsoni. We rescued him and nursed him through the tick fever. He has beautiful soft beds and toys that he loves ripping up.

GINGER ROGERS

Ginger Rogers suffered so much as a street dog. She caught distemper and also had blood parasite diseases from ticks. The distemper left her with severe neurological symptoms and the blood parasite diseases left her weakened and critically anaemic. She was becoming so emaciated as well. But she was lucky, as she was saved by us just in time.

CROWN

Crown came to us as a puppy with a badly injured leg. It was so severe we feared it might need amputation - but thanks to expert care, his leg was saved. He's now a healthy, affectionate boy who loves his meals, naps, and daily interactions with his carers.

MADDOX

Maddox was beaten, blinded, and left for the crocodiles. When he arrived at the sanctuary, he lifted his paw as if to say thank you – and he still offers it to everyone he meets. He may be blind, but he lives happily in a special compound with his friends. Despite his past, Maddox is affectionate and vocal, especially with his carers.

TEEGUR

Teegur was found as a blind kitten struggling to survive on the streets. He was taken in and cared for by our team. Now, he lives happily in our cats' unit, where he explores with his whiskers, cuddles with friends, and demands attention with his expressive meow.

MOTHER NATURE

Mother Nature was trying to find food for her babies when someone poured boiling water on her. When she arrived at the sanctuary, she was scared and in so much pain from the burns, but we treated her large wounds with care, using manuka honey and other treatments that worked miracles. Slowly, her wounds healed, and her pups and her survived against all odds.

NUTMEG

Nutmeg once had owners, but his life was one of neglect - chained tightly with no love or care. The chain cut deep into his neck, causing a horrific, maggot-infested wound that left him in unbearable pain. We rescued him and his healing began. The physical recovery was tough, but it was the emotional scars that took longer. But with patience and kindness, he blossomed into a playful, affectionate boy.

KITTY CAT

Kitty Cat had an accident in 2022 and sustained a broken pelvis. She was helped by us and has stayed with us ever since. She could not be released back to the streets and no-one has adopted her. Although she was quite feral and feisty when she first arrived at the sanctuary, she has become the sweetest, most loveable and playful girl.

FLASH

Flash arrived at the sanctuary in March 2022, disabled, weak and with no hope of surviving a harsh life on the streets of Sri Lanka. He also had babesia, a dangerous tick-borne disease, causing the destruction of vital blood cells, making him even more sick and frail. He is growing up fast and hopping around our beautiful garden like a kangaroo.

GATLING

In 2022, Gatling was discovered shot, left disabled, and barely holding on to life. Emaciated, dehydrated, and in terrible pain, we stepped in to help him. We removed the bullet, eased his pain, and gave him a chance to heal. Now, he's stronger, happier, and full of love.

PHOENIX

Phoenix was attacked by a village lynch mob who beat and stoned him and who were intent on killing him. They even dug his grave. He was innocent, terrified, broken, and didn't know if he could trust anyone ever again. He was left disabled, but his life was saved and he lives happily at the sanctuary.

GOPAL

Gopal had the most horrific head injury imaginable. The wound was extremely smelly and crawling with hundreds of maggots caused by flystrike. He was delivered to us in 2020, when others would have given up. Apart from his scar, which reflects his journey, his wounds have healed well and he spends his days hanging out with his friends at the sanctuary.







JUST RESCUED: THEIR FIGHT FOR LIFE BEGINS



Every week, Animal SOS Sri Lanka takes in ill, injured, and abandoned dogs and cats - each one desperate for help, each one deserving of a second chance.

Many arrive on the brink of death – starving, broken, and battling serious disease. Some have been hit by vehicles and left to suffer, others cruelly abandoned when they needed care the most. Thanks to your continued support, we're able to give them urgent medical treatment, a safe place to heal, and – most importantly – a reason to hope.

Here are just a few of the brave new arrivals now beginning their fight for life:

- **Pepper** Found with maggot-infested wounds and weakened by a dangerous tick-borne disease. He was in agony, but his gentle eyes still pleaded for help.
- Jasmin Her belly swollen from ascites and suffering from tick fever, Jasmin could hardly lift her head.
- Billie Jean Crushed in a train accident and battling multiple injuries. She's now receiving specialised care.
- Bula Arrived with a horrific leg injury and tick-borne diseases.
- Azizam Disabled in an accident and infected with tick-borne diseases.
- Gingerina Severely injured on the streets after a dog attack, and after just giving birth to 3 kittens. All kittens sadly died
 and mum was later transferred to us for treatments as she was fading away.
- Papare Road accident and left disabled. Has tick-borne disease.
- Pavlova Weakened by tick-borne disease causing severe anaemia and has demodectic mange.

Each of these animals is now safe - but their battles are far from over. They will need time, expert care, and gentle hands to heal, and we are committed to giving them exactly that.

We share their stories not just to show you the reality we face daily, but to remind you how vital your compassion truly is. Because behind every rescued animal is someone who cared enough to make that rescue possible.

2,700 ANIMALS DEPEND ON US EVERY DAY AND WE'RE DEPENDING ON YOU



Your support helps us feed, heal, and protect the animals who have no one else.

Every month, it costs £60,000 to keep our sanctuary running - to nurse the critically ill back to health, care for our resident animals, and feed thousands of hungry souls who have no one else. We feed around 2,700 animals a day, cooking up to 1.2 tonnes of food daily in our sanctuary kitchens. Feeding alone costs £30,000 each month - that's half of our monthly running costs! But food is only one part of the story.

We're constantly facing urgent repairs:

- Vital systems like our generator, water treatment plant and Reverse Osmosis plant, all need ongoing maintenance and servicing


